	I have contacted the Autism Alliance, a group of specialist autism providers, who were successful in a bid for the government Autism Innovation funding.	
	The key elements of use of the funding include:	
	<ol> <li>A "Charter" drafted by people with autism. This was completed in January and it urges people to;</li> <li>a)Promote awareness of autism</li> <li>b)Adjust the way their business works so that they are more autism- friendly</li> </ol>	
	<ul> <li>c)Consider employing people with autism</li> <li>2. A website which would be like a "Yellow Pages" of autism support services, as well as having a "trip advisor" type function. This is called "Autism Connect" and it is in place. <u>www.autism-connect.org.uk</u></li> </ul>	

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	<ol> <li>Engagement of Autism Champions i.e. people who would use their influence and public profile to promote the campaign and the three elements of our charter at a - c above. We now have 27 champions.</li> <li>Engage "national chains" to sign the charter and thereby commit to a - c above. 'Buy in' is already achieved from the following; Ryman, Next Plc, Wilko's, Butlins, Rolls-Royce, Nissan, NHS Business Services Authority and many more.</li> <li>Some members of the Autism Alliance have been piloting work at a local level, this has included linking with businesses and development and delivery of 'free' training.</li> </ol>	
	It would make sense for us to join with this national initiative where we can, as there seems to be a significant overlap between the work led by the Autism Alliance and some of the work of our Employment and Learning and Development Sub Groups.	
	We have invited a project lead from the Autism Alliance to come and meet with a small group of us, probably the leads of the Board and the Employment and L and D Sub Groups. We are expecting a date to be confirmed soon. At this meeting, we will explore how we can work with the Autism Alliance and Autism Connect. We hope that this will enable us to be more effective in achievement of our own desired outcomes. We will keep the Board informed.
